

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

Upon enrolment into this qualification, all students must:

- Undergo a literacy and numeracy assessment.
 - Be 15 years or over
 - Be physically able to perform practical tasks
- Have access to 3 calm, consistent and obedient horses

As part of this qualification, all students are required to have a suitable supervisor (over the age of 18) present for all practical tasks, who can ensure safety is maintained while the practical tasks are performed.





COURSE DELIVERY

The ACM20221 Certificate II in Horse Care (13 units) and ACM30821 Certificate III in Horse Care (18 units) are both self-paced qualifications. Students are given a maximum of 24 months from the date of enrolment to complete their qualification.

Online Learning

Students will be granted access to the Online E-Learning Student Portal. This is where all learning resources, theory and practical tasks will be allocated, with the addition of being able to upload any practical footage. Students can also message your assessor directly through the system.

The online system allows students to receive immediate access to their course content after enrolment and will get direct feedback through the portal from their assessor after assessments have been marked. This option is great for students who thrive on being able to work from any location without having to carry books and can also be great for school students completing work in assigned class time.





PRACTICAL COMPONENTS

Each unit contains theory and practical components. To complete the practical tasks within this course, students are required to have access to a calm, consistent and obedient horse (this horse can be your own, borrowed or leased).

The following tasks are included in the assessments, including - handling, transporting, lunging, and administering First Aid for horses. This course is designed for students to be able to complete from anywhere in Australia. To achieve this, we use a variety of methods to conduct your practical assessments.

These assessment methods include:

- Video submissions
- Projects
- Portfolios of documentation
- Third-party observations

For many units within the qualification, students have an option to either have their practical task videoed and submitted for assessment with our AEI assessors, or, for students that have access to a current Level 1 or above Equestrian Australia qualified Coach, Third Party Observations can be utilised.
